Meet our new Curate: Helen Halson!

Hi. My name is Helen and I am looking forward to joining you all at Abington as an Assistant Curate following my ordination in Peterborough on 6th July.

I'm 53 years old, married to James and I have a grown-up daughter called Jude. James and I live in Blisworth with our dog Lady. My daughter lives in Northampton with her partner, Paulo, and my Mum is also in Northampton.

My family moved to Blisworth from South Yorkshire when I was just 3 years old, so if you detect an occasional Yorkshire vowel mixed in with my Northampton accent it comes from my



parents and my older brother and sister! I have spent most of my life in Blisworth, with short spells in Towcester and Far Cotton, and I came to faith in my early 20's through Blisworth Parish Church. As my faith grew, I started helping with children's activities and whatever was going on at church alongside caring for my family and working. I confess that although I was allowed to do the cleaning and put daffodils in vases, I never progressed to flower arranging!

My working life began in Towcester Post Office where I spent 10 years. Then after a brief time as a driving instructor I started work at Blisworth Surgery, initially as a receptionist, then as a dispenser, accounts assistant and ultimately practice manager of what had become The Parks Medical Practice. The practice had grown to incorporate 4 sites, 90 staff and 23,000 patients, it was a huge job, but I had a great team, supportive GP Partners and we did some amazing things together, particularly through the pandemic.

By 2017, Blisworth Church, now part of Grand Union Benefice had their first female Rector. Although I helped in Church, even leading some services during an interregnum, I had never considered working for the church and I was pretty sketchy on what was actually involved.

The Rectors that I had known were all great and I learned new things about God from each one of them, but they were all men, and I assumed they had some special "holy" quality which was why God had called them. Our Rector Andrea was different, there was certainly something "holy" about her, even I could see that, but she was also very human, a similar age to me, she had a normal family with the usual ups and downs. So, I could relate to Andrea. Even so, when she suggested I go on an "Explore Day" I didn't do anything about it. By this time my first marriage had broken down and I had my hands full caring for my daughter and earning enough to keep our family home. Andrea, and the whole benefice were wonderfully supportive during this time and when the next Explore Day came around and Andrea asked again, this time I went, expecting that I would get signed up to a

children's work course or similar.

What I hadn't expected was feeling ridiculously excited as a small group were discussing ordained ministry. I got the impression that anyone was welcome, but I had plenty of objections, "I'm too old" was countered with "we have ordained someone who was 70". "But I have a job, I have to work" countered with "lots of people with families and jobs get ordained". Whatever my objection I was assured that God found a way to reach the people He was calling. Suddenly I started to see the possibilities and the way God was already working in me. When I reported back to Andrea she laughed and told me that she had seen a picture of me sitting in church but wearing a clerical collar. I was utterly flabbergasted.



My discernment process was long and complicated, having started it in 2017 here I am in 2025 just starting curacy, but I can see God's hand in it all the way through, from the challenging times to the wonderful times.

James and I married in 2019, Jude taking the role of father of the bride and walking me up the aisle.

I studied on the Lay Ministry course from 2020 to 2022 and then I was amazed once again when Bishop John informed me that I had completed the discernment process successfully and could begin full time training for ordination in September 2023.

James and I both took a huge leap of faith as I left my NHS career, and we put ourselves and our finances completely into God's hands. God is good and we have not gone short of anything we needed. Despite my lack of academic confidence, I made it through my college studies, and I was amazed once more when Bishop John invited me to explore the possibility of a curacy here with you all at Abington.

I am excited about the possibilities here at St Peter and St Paul and looking forward to working and learning alongside you all. Your worship, creative projects, and ministry to all ages is inspirational, reaching so many people with God's word and I am grateful for the opportunity to be part of your team.

My prayer for us all, from Psalm 25, "Show me your ways O Lord, teach me your paths; guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God may Saviour, and my hope is in you all day long."

A reading from Matthew's Gospel told us that Jesus said the first commandment is to love God, and the second is to love our neighbour as ourselves. Sandra reminded everyone that APV is part of the church at Abington. We are neighbours, and the residents, their families, and the staff are all prayed for regularly.

The service also included poems, prayers, and the hymns, 'Love divine, all loves excelling'; 'Guide me O thou great Redeemer'; and 'What a friend we have in Jesus.'

A resident, Shirley, recalled the hymn, 'Abide with me,' and read it out to the group, which was very moving.

Eighteen residents, with three carers, were present during the afternoon which ended with everyone reading the words of 'The King of love my shepherd is' as a prayer.



The team visited again on Wednesday 24th June for a Messy Vintage service based on the words of Jesus, "I am the gate; whoever enters through me will be saved. They will come in and go out and find pasture." (John 10.9) The activity was to use coloured pencils, felt tips, and stickers to create the most beautiful scene visible through the gate.
